The Levitt Pavilion for the Performing Arts, a unique open-air summer festival located along the banks of the Saugatuck River in downtown Westport, will present its 38<sup>th</sup> summer season beginning Sunday, June 26<sup>th</sup> and running through Sunday, August 28<sup>th</sup>. Almost **60 nights of FREE entertainment** will light up Westport for nine non-stop weeks. The Pavilion presents a vibrant range of music, featuring established and award-winning artists as well as emerging ones, from local bands to national and international acts, as well as a mix of other live performing arts including dance and comedy.

Summer '11 includes highly anticipated Pavilion debuts for South Africa rock phenoms **Civil Twilight** (Aug 27), NYC bust-out pop punk duo **Hank & Cupcakes** (July 16), Fairfield County's own roots rockers **The Alternate Routes** (July 9), folk sensations **Buskin & Batteau** (July 23) and vaunted swing banjoist **Cynthia Sayer and Her Sparks Fly Band** (July 3). Artists and acts returning by popular demand include Latin guitar world fusion group **Incendio** (July 24), Vegas veteran **Early Clover** (July 15), Andalusian treasures **The Val Ramos Flamenco Ensemble** (July 14), Gypsy Jazz legend **Frank Vignola** (Aug 14), and the lauded **Connecticut Ballet** (July 26). Outstanding children's shows include the return of world class illusionist **The Magic of Lyn** (July 6), as well as the Pavilion debut of string band **Rani Arbo & daisy mayhem** (July 27), and 4-time Grammy nominees **Trout Fishing in America** (July 20).

Throughout the season, look for the Pavilion's **RiverSwing Series**, special evenings on which a free pre-concert dance lesson, led by professional instructors, is offered in the style of the music that's about to be enjoyed – yes, there's a dance floor! Includes **Hector del Curto Tango** (Aug 4) and **Gas House Gorillas** (July 30).

In addition, each summer the Pavilion produces three to five ticketed events which help underwrite our close to sixty FREE performances. The Pavilion's Stars on Tour Concert Series will welcome "America's favorite little big band" **Big Bad Voodoo Daddy** to the stage on Sunday, July 10<sup>th</sup>. The Summer Gala will feature 3-time Grammy Award winners with **An Evening with The Doobie Brothers** on Thursday, July 28th. Tickets are on sale now. And keep an eye out for more upcoming Stars-on-Tour fundraising events throughout the summer and this fall.

Their name, taken from a Richard Brautigan novel, seems almost as incongruous as a picture of this musical duo: Ezra (guitar) stands six feet nine inches and Keith (bass), five feet five and one half inches. After three decades of writing, recording and performing together, Trout Fishing in America can look back at a body of work that is impressive and know they are just hitting their stride.
